

Guessing Gender Based Upon Forename

Careful! It's risky!

Two classic examples come to mind, **Jesse/Jessie** and **Francis/Frances**. Pretty simple... both are males. Right? Not so fast!

Using the Search function at FamilySearch¹ and searching for Forename = Jessie in the 1881 England and Wales Census reveals 36,645 individuals:

Further Filtering by Gender reveals:

So, while only about 6% are males that's still significant enough that one would certainly not want to make an **assumption!**

But, what if the “correct” spelling is **Jesse**? Again using the Search function at FamilySearch and searching for Forename = Jesse in the 1881 England and Wales Census reveals 15,663 individuals²:

For this spelling then Females are about 11%. Once again a large enough minority that one would not want to make an assumption!

An examination of **Francis** and **Frances** in the same 1881 Census of England and Wales reveals:

FORENAME	TOTAL	FEMALE	MALE	UNKNOWN
FRANCIS	58,812	9,237	49,598	2
FRANCES	59,444	56,959	2,501	1

The messages are clear to this author **“Do not make an assumption of Gender based upon a particular Forename”** and **“Validate the ‘correct’ spelling of the Forename”**. For the latter you may need to use The Genealogical Proof Standard as suggested by the Board for Certification of Genealogists³
